## CHAMPIONS = Hi Rise Ski Club!! CMSC Metro Cup 2015

On a beautiful Saturday July 25<sup>th</sup>, 19 members of Hi Rise ventured to Punderson State Park to once again participate in annual Metro Cup to join 84 golfers from 6 other ski clubs within the council. I am happy to announce that Hi Rise was once again successful in capturing the Metro Cup for our fifth time. Last year we had 28 golfers playing for us and ended up winning with 88 points and a 12 point victory. This year we did great again with 23 golfers and 79 points to win by an 8 point margin of victory. As good as this is with only a couple of shots or breaks here and there any of the top 3 teams could have been victorious which is why we have to continue fielding the best team that we can.

Thanks to Dr. Bob Akamine, the Metro Cup Chairman (for the first time) and the Hi Rise members on the committee, Guy Nerren, Jessie Anderson and Penny Kirby. You once again did a great job running a very successful event. As it was we were very competitive and had winners in two of the five events, a second and two third place finishes.

In men's medal play there was no chance of it being close as my hockey buddy, Rick Smelko, won by eleven strokes shooting a 73 and defending his ten stroke win from last year. We had a big win in Women's medal play that was won by our Ellen Bruin shooting 103 beating Kathy Dent by one stroke. Kathy prevailed in the tie breaker for second unlike last year when she lost a tie breaker for first.

Second place was captured by our four person scramble team of Bill Starr, Jim Macek, Pat Melia and Bob Maclauchlan shooting a 65, coming in second by two strokes. The two person Best ball team of Mike Stewart and Dan Kirby came up with big second place points shooting a 79, they were third in the competition but the scoring system only allow points for full teams in events.

The Co-ed Scramble team of Bob Akamine and Jessie Anderson received valuable third place points. The remaining golfer all received one point each which is very important in overall team scoring as we have lost on a tie breaker in the past and won by one point twice. Note that this year once again we did not play with mulligans to speed up play and probably increase scores.

The weather certainly cooperated this year and as usual we had a lot of fun on a competitive golf course and afterwards for the award ceremony. The dinner was very good, as usual, and we had numerous members win with their raffle tickets and skill shot winners. I hope to see everyone back again next and more including those that could not make it due to prior commitments. Continental will have a larger team as will Fagowees to win next year's Metro Cup.

**\*RESERVATIONS REQUIRED\***

Hi Risers prepare to have fun and eat a big picnic lunch after spending an afternoon canoeing the scenic Upper Cuyahoga River. This trip is open to all ages, families and friends. The river depth is 2 to 5 feet with a current of about 2 mph. Dam-controlled releases ensure that it is always deep enough to paddle. This is a short trip about 7 miles long. It begins at US 422 and ends back at Camp Hi. Our Special Hi Rise group rate is \$20 per person in a Canoe or a Kayak. This presumes two people in one rental canoe or single person Kayak. Little kids in the middle are \$1.50 each.

**Also, kids 12 and under eat for \$5.**

Check in with Paul between 11:00 AM and 11:30 AM at the Hi Rise Table, sign a waiver, pay your fee and **leave your car keys at the desk.** Get fitted for your life vests and paddles, take your cooler and board the Camp Hi bus. Two to three hours later you will be back at Camp Hi.

Don't have a partner? No problem. Rent a very stable kayak. Afterwards, we'll have burgers, dogs, chips, salads and pop. A pavilion is reserved for our picnic. Lynne always brings something homemade & Bob Mac cooks the burgers and dogs. Bring your own beer for discrete consumption on the river.

Kids and grandkids are welcome. They have a blast! Water balloons and squirt guns are OK. A hat, sunglasses, sunscreen and something to drink are important; maybe a rain jacket just in case and gloves if you are prone to blisters. A waterproof dry bag for your wallet and camera would be a good idea too. Sandals or old tennis shoes are best in the canoe. The clothes you wear may get wet and muddy while canoeing so leave a clean change of clothes in your car. Dogs are permitted in the canoes.

Turn east (left at Marathon station) on SR82 and go 2.5 miles to Abbott Road

Turn north (left) on Abbott, Camp Hi is one mile north on the west (left) side of the road

Drive past the check-in building on your left and down to the parking area on the left.

**From the East Side (almost one hour)**

I271 north or south to US422 east to SR44 exit
