

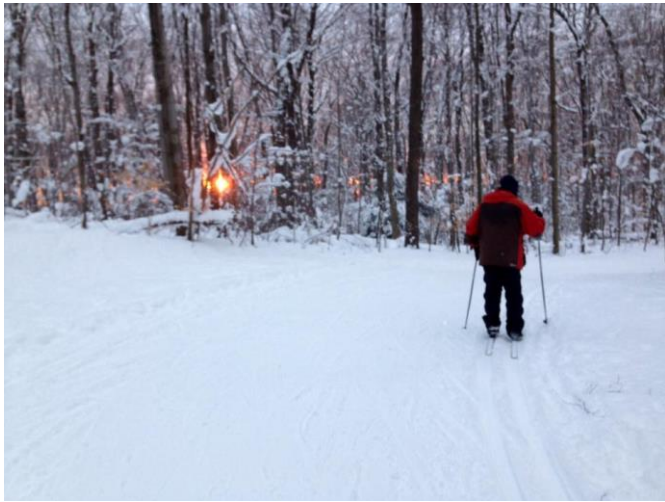

Vicki "Animal" Thornton, April 17, 1949 – November 11, 2015

Some memories shared by Vicki's Hi Rise Ski Club friends...



Hi Rise Ski Club and CMSC lost a dear friend and dedicated member. Vicki fought a long courageous battle with health issues and was only 66 when she left us to ski the big mountains in heaven.

Vicki was a long time and active member of Hi Rise Ski Club.

She loved to play volleyball and softball, and loved to go see the Cleveland Indians. Vicki also participated in summer trips to Toronto, and went house boating in Lake Cumberland. Vicki loved to talk with everyone. Conversations would almost always include stories about her two beloved dogs, Blackie and Tiffany.

Of course she loved to snow ski too! She raced in the CMSC Women's "C Vet" class for many years. She greatly loved the camaraderie of racing. Guy Nerren remembers Vicki easily smiling, laughing, and being friendly to one and all. He reminisced about a particular ski trip when Vicki left her luggage and ski gear in the parking lot of the departure point for a bus trip to Bristol. Always positive, she simply borrowed clothing and gear all weekend without complaining.

Guy explained how she got her nickname "Animal". Vicki liked to flap her arms like a chicken when she partied with her friends. Her nickname became "Chicken". However, she didn't like that and requested another. So, her friends gave her the new nickname "Animal" because of her focused approach and intensity when she played softball.

Vicki served on the Hi Rise board as Trips Chair for many years. Pam Korenewych remembers Vicki helping her when Pam ran the Swain weekend bus trip in 1999. Vicki wasn't able to go on the trip, but she still added her special touch to make the trip memorable for others. Pam recalls that when they returned Sunday night, they saw that someone had already brushed the snow off their cars. They later found out that Vicki braved the cold to do this for them. Many may not know this, but Vicki sometimes paid out of her own pocket for personal pan pizzas which were handed out to trip participants. She knew that folks going on the weekend trips probably didn't have time to eat dinner on Friday night before getting on the bus. Pam will always remember her unselfish, beautiful acts of kindness.

When Lisa Pucci joined Hi Rise back in the mid 1990s, Vicki was one of the first people to make her feel welcome in the club. Vicki chatted, laughed and introduced Lisa to other members. Vicki would make it a point to talk with all the new members. Lisa remembers Vicki always asked about Lisa's cousin who was diagnosed with breast cancer around the same time Vicki had received the same diagnosis. There was never a time when Vicki put her own health and concerns before those of others.

Mike Covelli first met Vicki when he was 15 years old at Brush High School. Years later, he was happy to become reacquainted with her at Hi Rise Ski Club. He describes Vicki as a loving, compassionate person who had a huge zest for life. Whenever she saw him, she would ask about his parents. Vicki loved people and was always considerate and joyful.

Vicki soldiered through her personal issues and showed us all how to be happy and live each day to the fullest. Vicki's compassion, friendliness and optimism will be always remembered and she will be greatly missed.
