Niagara Escarpment and NOTL Winery Tour (Nov. 5th & 6th, 2016) By Dennis Rosa, Wine Connoisseur



This was our pre-dawn breakfast before starting our second venture to the NOTL Canadian Wine Region with 44 anxious wine tasters. This year we tested the Niagara Escarpment that is west of the NOTL region. We

finished our breakfast and coffee on the bus and began the largest ever "wine tour bus raffle". With over four cases of purchased and home-made



wine to raffle off, along with many great donated raffle items from the attendees. Some were large and decorative works of art, a violin case with a portable bar including a bottle of wine. (Pegge Drysdale did some mean shopping, along with many of the other gift donors. It took over an hour to raffle off all the prizes. Thank you all for the donations to the make the raffle a success.

We headed to west of the Welland Canal on the Niagara Peninsula to Hidden Bench Vineyards and Winery near

Beamsville, Ontario. We ate our What-About-Bob's lunch the bus and then unloaded for the first



wine tasting and tour. The proprietor, Harald Theil met us and instructed us to break into two groups for the special sit down Wine tasting with artisanal cheeses. One group toured while the other group had the tasting. Harald informed all of us on the tour of the vineyards and wine making facility that groups as large



as ours are not normally permitted but somehow I was able to convince their Retail Manager Meg McGrath to let us in. This is one of Carol's and

my favorite wineries in the area. Harald also informed us that Hidden Bench is rated as one of the top three wineries in all of Ontario/Canada. The winery sits on the prime land in the area and land sells for \$75,000/acre vs. \$20,000/acre in the NOTL area to the east.

As you can see below their wine making facility had some of highest quality equipment (from France) and the building itself was made of beautiful wood construction. The oak casks below were just reconditioned from a craftsman from France this



summer. We did tour the vineyards first and were informed that Hidden Bench an organic/sustainable winery. They even used Asian radishes which grow very long like large carrots or parsnips to aerate the soil between the vines. They have three vineyards in which they grow Pinot Noir, Chardonnay, Riesling, Gewurztraminer, Cab Franc, Merlot, Cab. Sav. and some Malbec.

We made purchases then proceeded to Fielding Estate Winery down the road. This facility has a more modern architecture. Fielding broke us in to groups and started the tour and tastings. Fielding has an open building design with lots of windows that face toward the vineyards and

on



Ontario. The weather was just beautiful as we toured the vineyard and the wine making areas. The group wine tasting area was upstairs and had a view of the tank room and a glass wall to the outside.

The sunny clear weather helped us with the clear view of Lake Ontario and the vineyards from the Fielding Estate viewing decks.

We departed for Flat Rock Cellars which had a tasting table ready for us in the vineyard.



From the vineyard tasting we moved into the winemaking facility and into the retail / observation deck with the highest view of the vineyards and Lake Ontario, as Marilyn and others can attest.



We ventured to our last Saturday stop – Calamus Estate Winery. This was a smaller winery that was developed from an old farm and barn that was renovated to keep the antique beam/structure and modernize the second floor for sit down events and tastings. The owner reviewed the history and introduced the tastings. More good wine!



We headed for the Days Inn Near the Falls Hotel to check in. There was no check in needed and the hotel had all our room keys by name ready again. Some attendees visited Niagara Falls. We checked in and prepped for dinner. We all found different restaurants within walking or cab distance. There are a lot of excellent restaurants in the Fall's area. We went to Napoli's Italian restaurant and the food was great.



The great weather continued on Sunday as we had a continental breakfast at the hotel and departed for our



first stop – Jackson-Triggs Winery. Very modern and large with lots of glass to let the light in. We started with a sparkling white Brut wine which cleansed our palates.

We were pleasantly surprised by the quality of the wines at Jackson-Triggs along with the pricing. Of course we had a fantastic exchange rate that helped during our trip.



We toured the large commercial wine making area and were amazed at the number and size of the storage tanks. They informed us that the tanks we loaded by cranes through the open roof during construction.



We moved down into the barrel room for our final



We headed next door to Stratus Vineyards which is a modern, ergonomic and organic winery with French burgundy style wines. Higher prices and higher quality. We tasted our wines and visited the retail area and headed to the Little Red Rooster restaurant for lunch and gained strength for our final visits. Reif Estate



Winery is a German Style winery that had a wine making history in Germany. The original

immigrants decided they were going to build a winery in the NOTL region after tasting the wines being made with the concord and other local grapes (not good). We had an enjoyable host the entertained us throughout the tour and tastings, finishing off with a nice Vidal Ice Wine.





Coyote Run Estate Winery was the last tour/tasting stop before heading to Buffalo. While the tasting/retail building is small, the wine making facilities had quite a bit of capacity. We tasted in the different facilities and outside, along with some fruit flies to cap off a second great day of tastings.





We headed to Buffalo for dinner and beer tastings at the Big Ditch Brewing Company. They provided our own room to eat and finish off the day.



We headed back to the Kirtlander Party Center parking lot a little late. Hopefully everyone learned more and gained additional knowledge on region/winery history, viniculture, winemaking, grapes, types of wine and of course tasting wines. Special thanks to all that donated to the bus/wine raffle which was our largest to date and thank you all for attending and making the trip a **great success.** This was one of the most fun, educational and organized trips to date.
