Niagara On the Lake Wine Tour November, 2017

I remember my lovely wife, Amy, saying "You signed us up for what! A weekend bus trip in November to Canada! For wine? I sort of like white wine but cannot tolerate reds. And we have to be in Wickliffe at 6am on a Saturday and won't get home to Avon Lake until perhaps 11:30pm Sunday night. Plus I don't know anyone"!! I admitted this was all true but said that we would spend Saturday night in Niagara, Ontario and that I would go with her to the casino. She said, "Well all right then, let's be busers."



This was the Hi Rise Ski Club Fall wine trip organized by Dennis Rosa. I had heard that these were fun, fabulous and often sold out. So I was the first to get my money into Dennis. This trip was sold out by the way; I think maybe 48 people in all. There is the bus wine raffle. For ten dollars of tickets from the very attractive raffle lady we ended up winning three bottles of wine. In fact, just last night I enjoyed the Terra Boa 2014 red wine from Portugal. I thought I was super lucky but someone with extraordinary political connections won four raffle bottles.

We stopped at six wineries on Saturday and five on Sunday. Someone at each explains the history of the winery and then pours small samples of at least three of their wines with explanation and critique. Then you can buy bottles of their wines if you wish. Many did and the bottom of the bus soon filled up with boxes of wine. Lunch on Saturday was sandwiches on the bus. We overnighted at the Days Inn. Dinner was on your own – we walked to Weinkeller on Victoria Avenue in Niagara Falls. It was prix fix, farm to table with a nice wine list. Then we walked a block to the Niagara Casino. Amy was very happy and then about \$100 shy. Sunday lunch was at Silk's Country in NOTL and dinner was at Big Ditch Brewing Company in Buffalo. Both good.

There are too many wonderful wineries to mention but I most remember Wayne Gretsky Estate Winery at Niagara-on-the-Lake because it is so grand and because it also has a bourbon tasting room which many of us gravitated to. I bought a souvenir hockey puck.



You needed passports for this trip. Someone named Arnie grabbed his expired passport (the one with the hole punched in it) on a groggy Saturday morning. The Canadians pointed it out to him when we crossed the border. He decided to risk it rather than a taxi back to Cleveland. It turned out fine on Sunday night when we returned to the Home of the Free. His processing did not delay us at all. Thumbs up to Homeland Security!

What a trip. I got to drink wonderful wines and finally see the actual Niagara escarpment. It is composed of the Lockport geological formation of Silurian age which runs through western New York and southern Ontario. The escarpment is most famous as the cliff over which the Niagara River plunges at Niagara Falls and as the very difficult climb up which boats on the Erie Canal had to make through locks at Lockport NY in order to get to Buffalo.

My only complaint was about the Precious Cargo bus. The seat spacing was too close, worse than an airline. Plus the overhead storage doors would close on your hands rather than stay in the upright position. And the microphone was not reliable. The driver was good I thought.

What a terrific time. I got to tell my dung beetle joke and play the license plate game on the way back to Cleveland. Kudos to Dennis for his wonderful job of organizing this trip.
