# HI Rise Announces Trips to Crested Butte and Telluride!

At the March 22<sup>nd</sup> meeting Bob announced our western trips for 2023-24 ski season:



Crested Butte - January 7<sup>th</sup> to February 3<sup>rd</sup>
 Telluride - March 16<sup>th</sup> to March 23<sup>rd</sup>



Both areas provide excellent skiing with a variety of terrain and difficulty levels. And, we will be staying slope side at each area. Did I make your decision even harder?! Whether you choose both or just one, you are assured of some great skiing and great people! See page 5 for a ski area comparison.

Operating two western trips is not unprecedented for Hi Rise. However, with increasing lift prices and airline fares Bob has done a yeoman's job ferreting out a good value ski package. Using the Epic ski pass option is way to stretch your dollar. Crested Butte is \$1679, and Telluride will be announced. **See pages 12 &14 for more trip details**. Pricing for each trip does not include lift tickets. You may want to purchase an Epic pass but make your decision on your pass by April 16<sup>th</sup> as the price increases then. For a \$50 discount on the trip fee your purchase your pass from our tour operator. A link will be available soon. Here are the questions and answers Bob considered while creating this year's package. Here are questions and answers from Bob.

In case you missed it, at the last meeting we announced (and emailed the following day) our 2 (yes 2!) ski trips for next year, Crested Butte January 27-February 3rd. (Flyer attached) and March 16-23rd we are going to Telluride. My Q&A's are below:

### Why two trips?

Both of our 2024 trips will be to resorts that accept the Epic Pass. With 3 major season passes available, this gives you an opportunity to maximize your value if you choose to go on both trips as both resorts are serviced by the Epic Pass. Telluride is only available if you buy a full pass.

### Why announce so early?

The Epic Pass for 2024 just went on sale last month with the lowest price, available now (Which I am quoting below) only good if you buy it by April 16th, then pricing goes up. We are not using it but, Ikon Full is \$1,159 (\$250 more) and Base Plus is \$1,049. Also, since Covid, another effect was less properties available so spots are filling up early, Snowmass was almost sold out for groups in January.

### What is the trip price?

\$1,679 and it does not include lift tickets. (See flyer) Telluride will be announced in the next couple of weeks when air is released. Telluride price will also be with no lifts but there will be optional ticket pricing.

### **Epic Pass details:**

If you buy your Epic Pass (Full or Local only) from our tour operator you will receive a \$50 credit on your trip. There will be a private website set up for this next week. There are numerous different levels of passes, they are also good locally for Boston Mille, Brandywine, Alpine Valley and Seven Springs, Southeast of Pittsburgh.

**Epic Pass (Full)** \$909 This is the unlimited one with no blackout days at 41 resorts, 7 days at TELLURIDE, 7 days at Resorts of the Canadian Rockies, 5 days at 2 Japan Resorts and 26 partner resorts in Europe good for every open day all season. You also receive 10 Buddy Passes (not good for Telluride) if bought early. I used these for my son and others when we went to Tahoe last year. If you go on both trips and ski 5 days, you are paying \$91 per day to ski. (\$75.75 for 12 days total skiing all 6 days on both trips.)

Epic Local Pass \$676 Not valid on Holidays, good for only 30 resorts and not "peak dates" at major resorts. Telluride is not on this pass, Crested Butte is.

**Epic Day Pass** You pick from 1-7 days at 38 resorts including Crested Butte 3 days, \$289, 4 days \$375, 5 days \$455, 6 days \$530 and 7 days at \$600 excludes holidays but good if you don't want 5 days of skiing at Crested Butte.

Telluride is on this pass must you must buy the All-Resorts Epic Day Pass for at least 4 days. Priced at: 4 days, \$375, 5 days, \$455 and \$530 for 6 days. (\$88.33 to \$93.75 per day) for Telluride who had single day window prices on weekdays this season selling at: Adult \$209/Senior \$160. We unfortunately know these will not be coming down next year.

**Keystone Pass** \$361 Excludes holidays and is good at Keystone, Breckenridge (After April 1st) and 5 days at Crested Butte \$72.20 per day

Military Pass, \$159 Good for 37 North American resorts including Holiday access. Available to active, dependent, retired and veterans. Not good at Telluride.

Please check <u>Epic Season Pass</u> | <u>Epic Season Pass</u> You will find complete details and pricing here but buy your pass from our tour operator. Link will be available next week.

Prices continue to rise and we feel that by offering 2 trips and these options it gives you the best value for your trips.

### Crested Butte Trip (Now Ski in/Ski out hotel)

We will be flying into Gunnison airport through Dallas and a 40-minute bus ride to Crested Butte where we will be staying slope side at Elevation Deluxe Hotel, this is a ski in ski out property with plenty of amenities. <u>www.elevationresort.com</u>

### **Telluride Trip**

Fly into Montrose, Co. and bus up past the town and up the mountain to Bear Creek Condos <a href="https://www.telluride.com/business/bear-creek-lodge/">https://www.telluride.com/business/bear-creek-lodge/</a>

The gondola is less than 2 minutes away by shuttle, from there you can get on the slopes or go into town and return late into the evening. We can also walk out the back door and take the funicular down to the slopes and back up at the end of the day avoiding shuttles.

We stayed here 7 years ago and have already had numerous members asking to return with us next year.

### How to get your Epic Pass?

We buy this trip from a tour operator, Skigroup.net, who make all of the travel reservations for our trips, they were used for our Ogden trip this year and are doing these two trips for us. They also sell the Epic Pass but have to sell it at the list price but if you buy the full pass pr Epic Local Pass, you will get \$50 off of your lodging but only for one of the trips. They can be purchased online through the links below.

Click on one of the links below (it is the trip that you'll receive a \$50 discount on) and then "Purchase Now" from here you can choose what pass works best for you or play around with it before you commit. You can only buy 1 pass at a time as each pass is personalized and needs to be secure. Remember, these passes can be used at our local ski hills to get in shape for the big mountain trips.

# Crested Bute and Telluride by the Numbers




