## November Dinner of the Month,

#### November 1<sup>st</sup> at the Hofbräuhaus

We've all grown up hearing about the Hofbräuhaus. The original one was on East 55 and closed some time in the 1919's. Well, that Hofbräuhaus is long gone and today there are many Hofbräuhauses around the world. It is a microbrewery.

The Hofbräuhaus we know today began in the 1500's as a brewery in Bavaria. The Wilhelm V, Duke of Bavaria thought the beer in Munich was so bad that he commissioned a new brewery to be built. It became the Hofbräuhaus which means court brewery for the royals. The Hofbräuhaus beer they brewed was only meant for royalty. not for the commoners.

Finally, in 1828 King Ludwig I of Bavaria opened the brewery and made the beer available to his subjects. So, now we all can enjoy this beer.

The Hofbräuhaus in Cleveland opened on October 22, 2014, at Playhouse Square. It incorporated the old private club, The Hermit Club. The Hofbräuhaus brings many German beerhouse traditions to Cleveland including the Octoberfest, Masskrugstemmen (a Steinholding contest), live polka music and singing! The last time Hi Rise dined at the Hofbräuhaus we did a shotski! Maybe we'll have some more brave contestants! Check out their menu here.


#### Fall One Club

Cost is \$23 per person. Registration deadline is November 22. For more information see the flyer on **page 11** or talk to Meg Goetz.


# December Dinner of the Month Rider's Inn December 7<sup>th</sup>
