Changes at Powder Mountain and Snowbasin

Last winter Hi Risers had a great time skiing in northern Utah. As I mentioned in the aftertrip article last spring these two magnificent mountains were completely opposite. Snowbasin facilities were very much upscale, and Powder Mountain was very much old school. Both offered great hospitality and tremendous skiing.

Well, the facility gap between the two is about to change over the next few years. .

Those of us who took a free guided ski tour of Powder Mountain saw the multimillion-dollar chalets along the ski trails. Our guide pointed out that Netflix Co-Founder and former CO-CEO Reed Hastings owns one of the chalets. Over the summer Hastings, an avid snowboarder, gained controlling interest in Powder Mountain. He indicates that he will invest millions of dollars to upgrade the mountains with new



lodges, restaurants, new ski lifts, and new runs. He vows to keep the old school vibe of the area as well as continue to limit the number of skiers on the mountain. Staying Safe Online

With so much of our personal business is done online. we thought you might be interested in these online safety tips.

Staying safe online is essential to protect your personal information, privacy, and digital assets. Here are some important tips to help you stay safe on the internet:

Use Strong and Unique Passwords: Create strong passwords that include a combination of upper and lowercase letters, numbers, and symbols. Avoid using the same password across multiple accounts, as it can compromise your security if one account is breached. Change your passwords often, and keep a written record of your passwords off your computer in a secure location. Make certain you've enabled your security for your cell phone too, by adding a password or enabling facial recognition.

Enable Two-Factor Authentication (2FA): Enable 2FA whenever possible including your email accounts, online shopping, utilities, etc. –really any online account where you have payment info saved should have 2FA enabled. This adds an extra layer of security by requiring a second form of verification, such as a unique code sent to your mobile device or a voice message to your land line, in addition to your password you entered when you logged in.

Be Cautious with Personal Information: Be mindful of the personal information you share online. Avoid posting sensitive details like your address, phone number, or financial information on public platforms or in response to unsolicited requests. Please keep in mind that many surveys on Facebook pose questions that are very similar to security questions for online accounts. Examples: Was your first job at a fast food stand? What was your first car's color? What was the name of your high school? DO NOT EVER GIVE YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER OR ANY OTHER PERSONALLY IDENTIFIABLE INFO TO AN INCOMING CALLER.

Beware of Phishing Attempts: Be cautious of emails, text messages, or pop-ups asking for personal information or urging you to click on suspicious links. Verify the authenticity of such communications before taking any action. Avoid providing personal or financial information through email or unsecured websites. Please do not click on links in text messages unless you know the sender. Still uncertain if the text message is valid? Call the business or sender from a known number (not the phone number included in the text message) to verify validity.

Keep Software Updated: Regularly update your operating system, antivirus software, web browsers, and other applications. Software updates often include patches for security vulnerabilities, helping to protect your system from exploitation. Microsoft Windows 10 will no longer be supported by Microsoft after October 14, 2025. What happens when Windows 10 is no longer supported? If you continue to use an unsupported version of Windows, your PC will still work, but it will become more vulnerable to security risks and viruses. Your PC will continue to start and run, but you will no longer receive software updates, including security updates, from Microsoft.

Use Secure Wi-Fi Networks: When accessing the internet in public places, use secure Wi-Fi networks that require a password. Avoid using public, unsecured Wi-Fi networks for activities involving sensitive information, such as online banking.

Be Careful with Downloads: Only download software, files, or email attachments from trusted sources. Malicious files can infect your computer with malware, so be cautious and use reputable sources.

Be Careful answering phone calls from unknown numbers: If an incoming call is not in your contacts list, let the call go to voice mail. You can listen to the voicemail (if the caller even leaves a message), and then decide if you need or want to return the call.

Practice Safe Social Media Usage: Adjust your social media privacy settings to control who can see your posts and personal information. Be cautious about accepting friend requests or connecting with individuals you don't know personally. Romance scams typically start as friend requests—with the potential for conning you to send that new "friend" gift cards, or wire payments.

Regularly Back Up Your Data: Regularly back up your important files and data to an external hard drive or a secure cloud storage service. This helps protect your data in case of hardware failure, loss, or ransomware attacks. Save your electronically filed tax return files to an external hard drive and password protect that device.

Educate Yourself: Stay informed about current online threats, scams, and security best practices. Educate yourself on the latest cybersecurity trends and techniques to better protect yourself online. Cyber crime is organized crime. Offshore criminals have sophisticated call centers, with "sales" goals—the sales being your stolen assets. Remember: Microsoft will never call you. The IRS will not send local police to arrest you for some alleged owed/back taxes. If a loved one emails you that they are in jail and need money, make a phone call a related family member to verify.

But, despite your best efforts, you've fallen victim to a cyber scam. What can you do to protect yourself going forward?

Contact your local law enforcement to file a police report and obtain a hard copy of the report. Contact the 3 credit bureaus to place a credit freeze on your Social Security Number and date of birth. The credit bureaus are as follows:

- a. Equifax:1-800-685-1111; www.Equifax.com/personal/credit-report-services
- b. Experian: 1-888-397-3742; www.Experian.com/help.
- c. TransUnion: 1-888-909-8872; www.TransUnion.com/credit-help

Please keep in mind, that if you are making any big purchases that require the seller to verify your credit, you will need to lift the credit freeze to complete that purchase transaction.

Review your credit reports via this website, created to comply with the Federal Trade Commission's regulations and more information may be found via this link:

By reviewing your credit reports, you will identify any new credit accounts you are not familiar with; you can close them by contacting the credit bureaus. Set a reminder on your calendar to review your credit reports annually.

Remember, staying safe online requires constant vigilance and adopting good cybersecurity habits. By following these tips and practicing safe online behavior, you can significantly reduce the risk of falling victim to cyber threats.
