

You're STILL Skiing?!

Those of us who are skiing into our retirement and even those who are close to "that age" often hear the refrain – You're still skiing? – wow. Skiing as a senior does require some amount of caution and preparation that we didn't necessarily need back in the day. Here are some common sense tips I learned from the Freedom Village article <u>Skiing at 70: Ski tips for Seniors</u>.

First, prepare yourself physically throughout the year including the summer. Back in the day we played volleyball, softball, biked and just kept active. Today not so much. Pick a summer activity like biking, or paddleball, to keep active along with regular visits to the gym or with home exercises. Before you head out to the slopes, start your day with some stretches. Be sure to have updated and properly fitted equipment - your old Hart skis and Lange boots should stay at home. Bring out the new helmet and call up your ski buddy – don't ski alone. Now, onto the slopes... if it's been a while, take a lesson. On a personal note, when I returned to skiing after a 20-year hiatus, I took a lesson at Boston Mills. What a game changer that was for me. Once on the slopes, know your limits and enjoy the experience. Ski the runs you are comfortable with although as you move through the day you can challenge yourself if you are not too tired. Take more breaks than you did

years ago and stay hydrated. Bring along a water bottle. Your ski day may end at 2:00 or 3:00, you don't have to be the last off the mountain. Enjoy the experience – smell the mountain air. Most importantly be grateful and thank God that you are still able to ski.

Racing News

Are you thinking of ski racing this season? If you are new to racing or haven't raced in many years, you may participate in Race Demo. On the day of the race, you can try out the racecourse to see if you like racing. You may take two free runs through the course. If you decide to race you must register. Your registration fee may be covered by Hi Rise provided you follow the Hi Rise registration rules below. If you decide not to race, you are not charged for your runs through the course.



The registration rules are as follows: If you pre-register and are a member of Hi Rise your race registration fee is covered by the club and you must participate in five races, Hi Rise pays all your fees. If you do not pre-register, you must pay the onsite registration fee of \$25 fee yourself and you will not be reimbursed by Hi Rise. If you do not participate in five races, you are responsible for all your race fees at \$20 per race and Guy will hunt you down for your fee. LOL

Secondly, work assignments for race days will be made. If a racer fails to complete his/her assigned task, your race for that day will be considered a DQ. BTW, only one third of all racers are assigned tasks at the day's race.

MEMBERSHIP- You must be a member of Hi Rise to race on our team. Contact Guy, Rick, or Nate Diederich. RACE SCHEDULES- Are available at meetings, on our Web Site. In our NEWSLETTER, on CMSC WEB SITE. ADVANCE REGISTRATION FOR RACES- Forms are available at meetings, on our WEB SITE, and in our

NEWSLETTER. Hi Rise will pay race fees for those who advance register and attend 5 or more races. Some races will be advance register only. To register yourself late on race day will cost you at least \$25.00 per race. COMBINED RACE WEEKENDS- SKIER COMBINED is at Bristol. SNOWBOARDER COMBINED is at

Swain II. BOTH require advance registration. NO registration on race day. BOTH require that you have two races started prior to the combined event.

WORK ASSIGNMENTS- For each race, one-third of our racers may be assigned to work that race. Assignments are posted in the bib pick up area. It is your responsibility to check the list. If you are assigned to work, show up at least 15 minutes prior to the start of the race, If you prefer to work at or not work at a particular race, let Guy or Rick know at least a week in advance. RACERS WHO FAIL TO SHOW FOR WORK ASSIGNMENTS WILL BE Dqd. HELMETS- Are required for every race.

NO BYOB- Please do not bring your own booze onto the ski area premises.

LIFT TICKETS- Some areas may offer discounts for racers and may ask to see your bib. Others may only sell online. DQ & RESULT SHEETS- Are usually posted in the bib pick up area about one hour after the last race of the day. It is

your responsibility to check to verify your race times and/or any DQ. If you dispute either the times or the DQ, find Guy or Rick to discuss the issue and possibly file a protest. The time limit to do so is 30 minutes after posting.

START TIMES- For most races will be 10:00 AM for the first GROUP of the day. Some races may start earlier. RACE ORDER- For most races will be: GROUP I SKIERS: Super Senior Vets, Open Elite, AAW, AAM, AW, AM, BBBM, A Qualifiers. Then, after about 45 minutes, GROUP II SKIERS: Senior Vets, BBW, BBM, BW, BM, CCW, CCM, CM C Qualifiers, Then ALL SNOW BOARDERS. A few races may have different start orders which are posted in the bib pick up area.

CLASS CHANGES- If you wish to ask to change your assigned race class, you must do do through Guy or Rick, at least seven days prior to the next race.

QUALIFICATION- For both skiers and boarders if you have never raced in CMSC before, or have not in some time, you can qualify at any race by registering as a QUALIFIER and completing two runs after which you will be assigned to a racer class that matches your ability.
