




Hi Rise Fall Clambake

chicken, sweet potato, corn, and broth for \$41 per person. This price does not include beer,









La Nina May Bring Snow this Winter!

Summer is nearing its end, and it has been a hot one. A preliminary long range winter forecast from Direct Weather predicts a La Nina indicating a cold and snowy winter for the Great Lakes! Direct Weather is a trusted source for weather forecasting.

A La Nina winter brings colder and snowy weather to us as well as to New York and points east of us because the jet stream moves air and precipitation across the northern part of the U.S. toward the Atlantic Ocean. Who knows, we may even get to ski more in Ohio and New



York this winter! Our western skier friends may enjoy more snow and colder temperature, too, including Colorado, Wyoming, Idaho, and Utah.

Well, this is a very early winter prediction. It can change. I'll be sure to let you know how accurate this La Nina prediction is in April - after ski season. If you'd like to see the Direct Weather

The answer is... c. Chile. SnowBrains reports that the most modern ski area in Chile is Centro Ski Pucon is built on the Villarrica Volcano at 9,383 feet. The volcano has been spewing plumes smoke at a higher-thannormal rate this winter – remember it is mid-winter south of the equator. The volcanic activity has even caused earthquakes; however, the danger level is considered low. No one has been evacuated from the ski are nor the ski town Pucon, Chile, a.k.a. "the adventure capitol" of Chile although the town of Pucon was evacuated in 2015 but not in 2024.


