Get Ready for the e-Ski!

First there were snowmobiles, then we saw e-bikes, now we'll see self-propelled skis on the mountain! They look like regular skis but have small snowmobile - like tracks on the back of each ski. This battery powered ski is called Vipera. Gurnoor Sooch from Vermont came up with the idea as a way to get around long lift lines. He patterned the tracks after the snowmobile only much smaller. 
Please consider running for the Board. You may nominate yourself or ask a friend to nominate you. The board meets once a month on the first Tuesday of the month.

Our Jackson Hole Adventure 2025

This trip was offered to our members last May with 40



spots available, after filling up quickly, we ended up with a total of 52, looking forward to a week of fun with friends old and new. Of course, the primary reasons were to ski arguably the toughest mountain in North America and to enjoy the beautiful vistas from the Tetons to Yellowstone Park with the world famous Old Faithful geyser continuing to erupt on a regular schedule.

We gathered at the airport and flights were on time, landing at 1:22 PM (MST) collected



our bags (no lost luggage, unlike last year) and took the 15minute drive into the town of Jackson. Population of 11,000 at an elevation of 6,237', where numerous western movies have been filmed over the years. The town is nestled in between scenic Teton mountains with a ski slope (Snow King) located on the edge town. We checked into our hotel, 49er Inn, located only a few blocks from the busy center of town. An older property that has gone through numerous remodels but they do cater to groups of all sizes.

We met at 5:30 in the lobby/breakfast area (A good breakfast with many options was included everyday) for our welcome party, we were served enough food



and beverages that most of us didn't have to go for dinner that evening. The 49er has its own bus and driver (he recited a different Western themed poem everyday) who transported us to and from the mountain (20-30 minutes away) every day. Departures to the mountain at:



7:30, 9:00 and 10:30 AM with return runs 1:30, 3:00 and 4:30 PM. The city bus also ran regular from outside our door for only \$1.50 each way, in town the bus was free to get us around.



Jackson Hole Mountain is a legendary skiing destination, a tram, 2 gondolas and 10 other lifts servicing 131 runs with 4,139 feet of vertical drop. This is more difficult than other resorts bosting 50% of runs being expert but enough runs to offer something for everyone, although a blue in Jackson is more like a double blue or black at other resorts. There is also an iconic run, Corbert's Coulier, where they hold an annual event known as King's and Queen's of Corbet's, the world's best skiers and boarders (male & female) launch into the 40 plus feet drop with rock walls on either side doing flips and other tricks. The contestants are also the judges, this event occurred just before we arrived and the winners were crowned on the Saturday.

Sunday was our first day on the slopes and we were welcomed by over a foot of fresh powder, this pattern continued for the next 2 days. Over those 3 days the snow was over my boots, just below my knees and on Tuesday over my knees, great conditions! At least for us who enjoy fluffy snow, others do find it difficult, probably

because we don't get the opportunity to play in it enough. On the slopes they continued to get new snow everyday but under 6 inches. Visibility improved every day, giving us a great vista on Friday viewing 40-50 miles over the town and mountains. We had great conditions and certainly enjoyed the hot tubs after arriving back to the hotel.

Not everyone spent all of the time going downhill, 15 -20 took an all-day snowmobile trip (Individual machines) through Yellowstone and ending up at Old Faithful in time to see it go off. Others cross country skied, walked through downtown enjoying museums and the history of Jackson. Between the airport and town, they have National Elk Refuge, created in 1912 to protect one of the largest elk herds. As winter begins in December they start heading down from the mountains to the refuge where they are fed and





protected from predators until spring when they head for the hills. You have to be careful driving at night during these times. On Monday evening, we took over the lobby of the 49er again, and enjoyed a catered meal by Bubba's BBQ eating pork, chicken, brisket, sides and salads followed by many conversations and a few card games afterwards.

Thursday evening, we enjoyed pizza and salad again in lobby followed by more games and watching the USA, Canada championship hockey game.

After a day on the slopes a group of us headed to Snow King hockey arena to watch a local group of hockey players (I skate with some of them) play against the local semi pro team that competes in a regional league from other ski towns such a Vail, Aspen,


Tahoe, Sun Valley and others. It was a good game but the home team (who are used to the altitude) prevailed.

On Saturday we headed to the airport and arrived home on time at 10:30 with all of our bags, unlike last year.

We had no injuries but we had an ACL from the week before and a case of Covid, both went home on Tuesday.

Thanks to everyone that participated and helped with the trip. We're off to Steamboat in 10 days.
