What Do Leather Car Seats Have to Do with Skiing This Winter?

Could your leather car seats diminish your skiing experience? The answer is yes, but how? Look at the Amazon Rainforest. Yes, the RAINFOREST!

If you've been to the Cleveland Metroparks Zoo Rainforest exhibit, you may have noticed the rainforest deforestation display with its acreage countdown of deforestation. The diminishing numbers are indeed quite dramatic. So, what's the problem, you ask. You see, as rainforests are cleared, their ability to add moisture to the atmosphere is diminished. Yes, the oceans provide moisture, too, but the rainforest adds to the atmosphere's moisture content and temperature regulation as well. This change causes the world's weather patterns to change to drier weather around the world including the American

Why is there rainforest deforestation in the first place, you ask. Your first thought may be


for lumber or food crops. Yes, they are part of the picture, but you'd be wrong. Most of the land is used for cattle ranching! Sixty-five percent of the deforested Amazon rainforest is devoted to raising cattle. Cattle are raised for human food, and leather goods. Remember, cattle need food, too, so even more land is



cleared the grow corn, soy, oats, and other crops to feed the cattle. It's an endless cycle, and rainforest soil cannot sustain ongoing crops growth for very long.

Ah, so there's the connection. Our beef and leather consumption are driving rainforest deforestation resulting in weather pattern changes leading to drier and shorter winters, thus fewer ski days, less snow, and more expensive skiing.

Okay, what's being done? The Amazon Rainforest countries plan to ban clear cutting of rainforest vegetation by 2030. That is five years away. Ironically, the rate of deforestation has increased since 2018 (see the chart to the right). So, what can you do at home? Cut back on the beef you eat and don't buy as many



leather goods. There are also several environmental organizations you can support, too. These organizations are listed in the attached articles.

Farming practices, corporate decisions, governmental policies thousands of miles away, and our consumption of beef and leather goods do indeed contribute to a shorter ski season. To read the original article in SnowBrains click here; and click here to learn about cattle ranching in the Amazon.
