Rock Logic is a six-person band that will play dinner music during dinner and dance music after dinner.



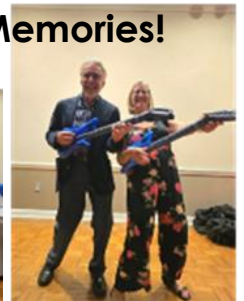
Dinner is served family style at each table. The food is great – as always!

The April Dinner of the month was at the Pub 1812 at Rider's Inn. We do not have any pictures of the members who attended, unfortunately. But here is a short history of the former Reider's Inn.



The original Reider's Inn was reopened as The Pub 1812 at Rieder's Inn. It was established by Joseph Ryder in 1812. The new owner Leonard William and his daughter Alishia brought its name from an earlier time - Rider's Inn 1812. Originally the inn was a stagecoach stop and later became a stop for the underground railroad, and in the 20th century it was a speakeasy – what else. Hi Rise Goes to Killington *February 22-27, 2026*

Let's try something different, go somewhere new, give us a new experience!

Members speak and we listen, so bright and early Sunday morning 27 of us made the easy journey to Cleveland's Amtrak Station downtown located by the football stadium. Parking was free, 2 checked bags, 2 carry-on bags were also free, sit anywhere you want on the train, no TSA and trains keep a tight schedule! They asked our group to arrive early so they could get all the bags checked and prepared so they could be quickly loaded onboard when the train arrived at 5:50 AM from Chicago. Bags were

loaded, we boarded, made a lot of noise waking up those that were trying to sleep. Carry-on bags were stored in the spacious overhead compartments (no doors) or at our feet where leg room was endless and the fully reclining comfortable seats made us feel like passengers, not just a fare. We started out from the station and through to Euclid at what seemed to be a snail's pace but we were on our way.



Travelling by train is less stressful compared to flying, not having to worry about delays, weather, missed connections, lost luggage etc. We could stand, sit, sleep, wander around, congregate in groups, travel between cars always ending up at the bar car.

Stops on the way were in the larger cities, Erie, Buffalo, Rochester, Syracuse, Utica and a few others before arriving on-time in Albany at 2:53 PM. There we were met by our charter bus and all of our luggage, departing the train station by 3:30. We were all very comfortable in our 55-passenger bus, Yankee Trails. The driver took us to the town of Rutland, population 16,000 and 21 miles from Killington. We were dropped off at a local grocery store to buy our provisions and beverages for the week. The Rutland City bus goes all the way to Killington and Pico resorts so if we wanted to, we could easily commute back and forth as we wished. The city bus was also our transportation to the ski hill and back every day picking us up at locations throughout our condos every 15 minutes.



The bus dropped us off at The Pinnacle Condos less than a mile from the ski resort. We had 2 bedrooms, 2 bath condos in 4 of the 6 buildings. We were close to each other but when you take into consideration the cold and that it's built on a snowy and icy mountain it could be a challenge getting around. They were large enough and well equipped to house us for a week with many amenities including a complex that housed a large hot tub, steam room, sauna and bar in one of the buildings. A number of us met up there every day after skiing. Transportation in the evening wasn't easy, if we wanted to go to most of the restaurants, we would have to take the ski bus to the



resort and then catch the city bus that only runs once an hour after 6. Pinnacle has no restaurant but 3 of our neighboring accommodations did that were less than a 5-minute walk. The Killington Distillery had good food and many of us ate there more than once.

Skiing, that's why we came here, shuttle buses to the resort were every 15 minutes with a couple of stops we were there in 5 minutes. Killington is known as "The Beast of the East" because it's the largest resort in the east, having the most runs and

higher elevations. 155 runs on 1,509 acres, 3,050 vertical feet, 21 lifts, 73 miles of trails spread out on 6 peaks.

Conditions were good for the week, I was quickly reminded that due to the higher humidity in the east, it feels much colder out there than it does in the west and it's very open so can get windy. They have 2 gondolas; one takes you to the very peak for great vistas and to start the longest run from top to bottom. The snow was good as was the coverage. My only complaint is that they continually were blowing snow all week on the mountain. They open in November and last year closed in June (yes, you can still get a couple of month's skiing in this year) and are building the base to extend their season. It was cold going through those blasts.

Pico Mountain is a short 20-minute ride on the town bus from Killington's parking lot, it is a very old school mountain with no high-speed lifts, like most of us learned to ski on. It has 7 lifts (only 4 were open) 1,967' vertical drop, 58 trails and 468 acres. I was looking to do half a day there but spent a full 7 hours there, Arnie and his roommates went back the next day to ski until noon. You can ski this on the Killington or Ikon Passes. There were also racers going on one of the slopes giving us less to ski but still a fun day. I found the snow to be even better here than at Killington. This was going to be their last week of the season so I'm happy that we went.

Tuesday night was our group dinner at Choices Restaurant, only about a mile away but not walkable. Fortunately, I had arranged with Rutland City bus use one of their buses to transport us there and back as a group. They claim to be the best Seafood and American comfort food in the area. They now have 27 new believers.

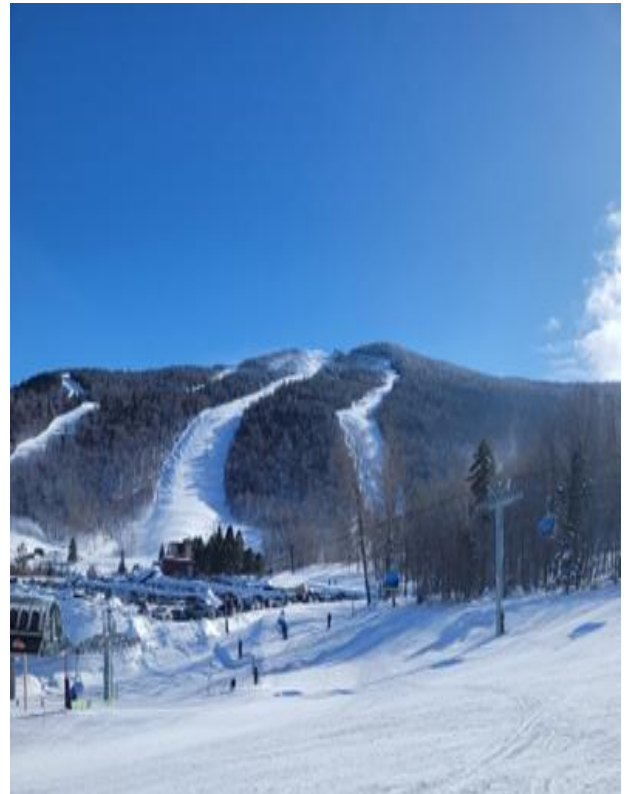
They have a large, diverse menu so working with them we narrowed the choices down to 6 choices, salmon (4), chicken marsala (4), piccata (4), shrimp & scallop Neptune (10), tri tips (4) and 1 fettuccine primavera, all served with salad, bread and desserts. Everyone enjoyed what they ordered, I was with the majority of 10, ordering the Neptune that I found perfectly done and full of wonderful flavors. Alcoholic beverages and extra food were separate bills and desserts were late coming out but our city bus was on time with other passengers. This is when the restaurant's POS system went down while we waited for our bills and the bus for us. The driver was kind enough to wait for us after the manager offered him a dessert. Crisis averted and fun had by all.

Skiing went well all week with mostly sunny skies and a lot of snowmakers blowing on the slopes. Only one small injury at Pico, Mike fell in front of me, cut his nose and broke his thumb.

Friday was checkout, our train was departing Albany at 7 PM and the charter bus was picking us up at the mountain by 3. Only Vicky and Sandy decided to use their Ikon Passes on Friday and skied until 2 PM. The rest of us packed up and vacated the condos by 11, leaving our luggage for the bus to pick up, we took the shuttle to the bottom of the mountain where we enjoyed a nice long lunch overlooking the slopes. Our bus driver got lost and didn't pick us up until 4:30, we only had 2 ½ hours to catch the train and she had to get permission to exceed the speed limit for us to make the train. Fortunately, we were in contact with Amtrak and they did a great job getting our luggage off the bus and onto the train in less than half an hour. (I'd like to see the airlines do that!)

The train left on time for our scheduled arrival in Cleveland at 3:30 AM. Quiet time is 11-8 so we enjoyed a few fun hours before trying to sleep between stops and the continuous blowing of the train horn. When we arrived on time in Cleveland, everyone picked up all of our bags and headed home for a few hours of catch-up sleep. I enjoyed the train and will consider using it again in the future. The times aren't the most convenient but is enjoyable.
