Ski the West with Hi Rise! There is Still Room for You



This year Hi Rise travels to the far west all the way to Oregon. Mount Bachelor is the seventh largest ski area in the nation located on the eastern flanks of Oregon's Central Cascades. It is known for light and dry snow. It is actually a dormant volcano. As with any volcano it can erupt, but unlikely to do so. The last time it erupted was 2,000 to 10,000 years ago.



Since The top of the mountain has no trees, you can actually ski around the top of the mountain, circling the volcano crater. Mount Bachelor boasts 72 runs with something for everyone. The back side has top expert runs for the best skiers. For those of us who like to cruise there are plenty of intermediate blue runs. Snow boarders are treated to several terrain parks located throughout the mountain. Mount Bachelor operates 12 lifts including 7 express quads, and 56 kilometers of groomed cross-country trails. Ski News from Around the World

No Fireworks for the Fourth of July at Colorado Ski Resorts

For many years Colorado ski resorts like Vail, Telluride, and Breckenridge have offered fireworks for their Fourth of July celebrations. What would the Fourth be without loud booms and a colorful display of red, white, and blue? Maybe you've been lucky enough to experience these ski area celebrations in the summer. Well, if you go again, there will not be fireworks on the Fourth. Never fear, there will be a show, but next time it may be a show with drone technology and lasers. According to the online newspaper Freeskier article [Why Ski Resorts Are Replacing July 4 Fireworks With Drones](#) old school fireworks are not environmentally friendly and can cause forest fires in the current dry summer conditions.



Drone technology used in light shows is relatively new but laser light shows have been around since the 1970's. Does anyone remember the quirky laser show at the Allen theater in the early 70's. Laser light shows, in particular, have come a long way since then and even from the old laser shows at Sea World in the 1980's. Today laser and drone shows are quite spectacular. The first drone light show premiered in 2012 and has grown into a 1.5 billion dollar industry in 2025... yes 1.5 billion dollars.

Drones in a light show work like pixels on a giant computer screen in the sky. With computer programmer skills, far beyond those of this author, programmers can create some spectacular shows. And, the drones are reusable unlike old school fireworks. However, the building of all these drones do, indeed, produce their own environmental concerns. See the Freeskier article cited above. Now you may ask, are drones used during the regular ski season. Although private use of drones at ski area is strictly prohibited for safety and privacy concerns, they can be used by ski patrol to locate victims, snowmaking, and even cloud seeding to encourage natural snow in dry winters. They are even used for mapping and avalanche control. So, high technology has become an important piece of ski area management and development.

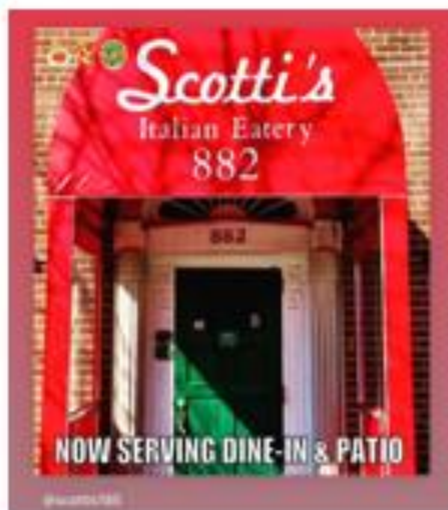

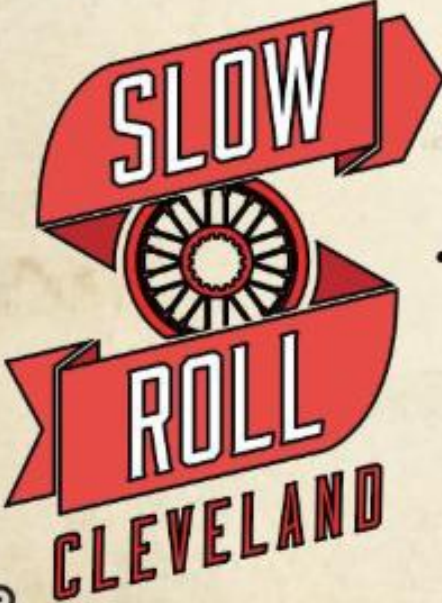

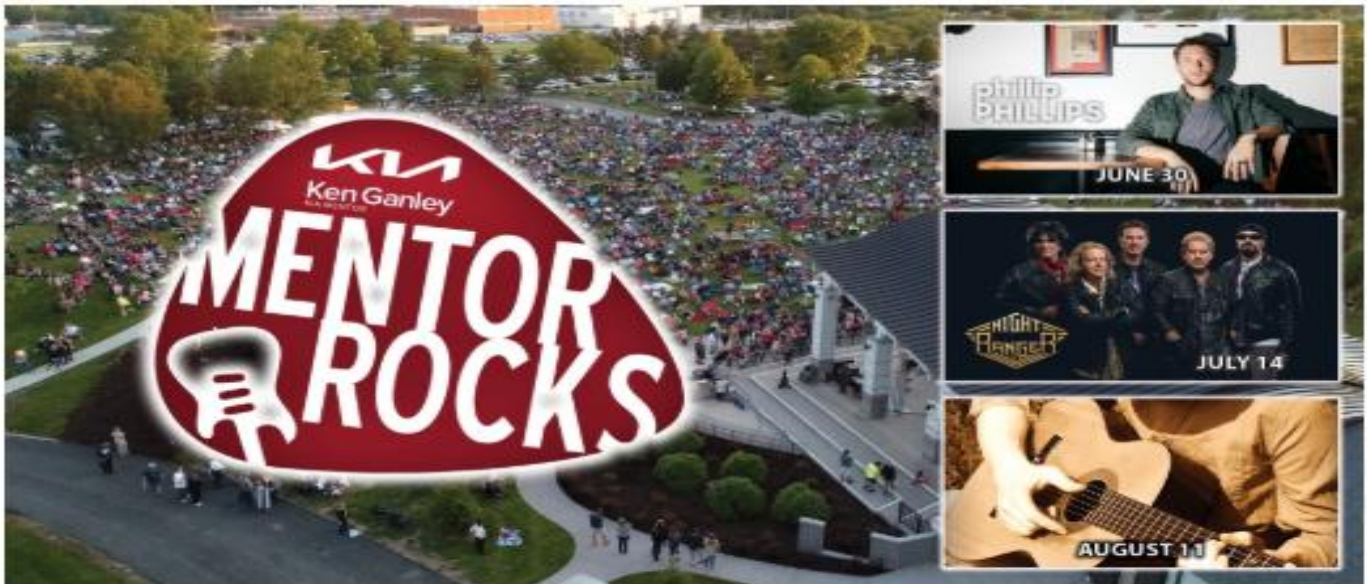
